

## OUTRAGES 'N ARMENIA.

### Mass Meeting at Worcester Adopts a Memorial Addressed to the President.

(Special Dispatch to the Boston Herald.)

WORCESTER, Dec. 7, 1894. A mass meeting, called by prominent citizens, was held in the hall of the Y. M. C. A. building this evening, to protest against the outrages in Armenia.

P. W. Moen, general manager of the Washburn & Moen Manufacturing Company, presided, and speeches were made, by Mr. Moen, Rev. Dr. Archibald McCullagh, Rev. M. H. Hitchcock, formerly missionary in Turkey, Judge W. T. Forbes, Mayor Henry A. Marsh, Rev. Dr. John D. Pickles and Rev. Dr. Elijah Horr.

A memorial was adopted, addressed to President Cleveland, calling attention to the recent massacres and asking for immediate action to secure to the Armenians from the Turkish government such reprisal for the past and such security for the future as shall be commensurate with the demand of modern civilization.

Copies of the memorial were ordered sent to Senator Hoar, Congressman Walker, and to the legations of France, Germany and Great Britain at Washington.
